EMEE 2020 - 13th International workshop on "Empirical Methods in Energy Economics"

January 13 - 14, 2020

The 13th International Workshop on Empirical Methods in Energy Economics will be held at CEPE in Zürich on **13 - 14 January 2020**.

The EMEE workshop is intended as a forum for the development and application of empirical methods in energy economics. It follows the tradition of successful predecessors held in Zurich, Switzerland (2008), Jasper, Canada (2009), Guilford, England (2010), Dallas, Texas (2011), Berlin, Germany (2012), Ottawa, Canada (2013), Aachen, Germany (2014), College Park, Maryland (2015), Oviedo, Spain (2016), Los Angeles, USA (2017), Milano, Italy (2018) and Quebec City, Canada (2019). To foster a lively debate and exchange of ideas about new empirical research in energy economics, we especially welcome submissions based on novel econometric techniques, original and extensive datasets, rigorous study designs and having important policy implications. We especially encourage submissions pertaining to the following four broad fields:

1. Experimental and quasi-experimental design
2. Time series
3. Structural econometrics
4. Machine learning econometrics

The format of the 2020 workshop will be plenary presentations (i.e., no concurrent sessions) followed by short discussions, egg timer sessions and poster sessions. Overall, the scientific committee will select approximately 30 papers. A keynote speech will also take place.

The papers and posters for the 2020 workshop will be selected on the basis of extended abstracts (3 - 5 pages) structured as follows: 1) overview, 2) methods, 3) data and 4) preliminary results.

The deadline for submitting the extended abstracts (in PDF format) is October 15th, 2019.

The abstracts will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee (see below), with acceptance decisions notified by November 10th, 2019. The extended abstract should be attached as PDF file to email sent to the workshop address (emee-workshop@ethz.ch). Please write "EMEE paper submission".

Registration will be possible **from November 1st, 2019 till December 16th, 2019** (registration fee € 180). **Final papers / presentations**, which will be available from the conference website, need **to be submitted by January 6, 2020**.

About the venue:

The conference will take place at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology (ETH) in Zürich. For participants interested in enjoying the Swiss Alps, the local organizers will propose a mountain adventure in Airolo from Saturday late afternoon January 11th until Sunday January 12th.
